

## Sample Unlimited Travel Ticket Fares 2011

These sample fares are provided for convenience to give an idea of travel costs. Thousands of fare combinations are available, so check at the time of booking for the particular journey you are interested in.

Children's fares are available for almost all ticket types and are usually charged at 50% of the adult value for rail tickets. A family railcard gives additional savings for both adults and children in the group.

**Freedom of Scotland Travelpass.** This pass is available to anyone and includes unlimited rail and ferry travel with Caledonian MacBrayne within Scotland, as well as free bus and coach travel on some routes that connect with trains. It also includes a discount of Northlink Ferries seated fares. A version for international travellers is available from Britrail.

**Highland Rover.** Unlimited rail travel on the Glasgow to Oban and Mallaig routes, Inverness to Kyle of Lochalsh and Wick/Thurso routes, and south to Aviemore. Also coach travel on Mull and Skye and Caledonian MacBrayne ferries to Mull and Skye. Discounts on the Northlink ferry from Scrabster to Orkney.

**Central Scotland Rover.** Rail travel between Edinburgh, Glasgow Queen Street, North Berwick, Bathgate, Dunblane, Bridge of Allan, Stirling, the Fife Circle, Markinch, Falkirk and all intermediate stations. Also valid between Edinburgh Waverley, Brunstane and Newcraighall, and on the Glasgow Subway.

**Citylink Explorer** tickets give unlimited coach travel throughout the Scottish Citylink coach network.

**Island Rover.** Unlimited travel on the Caledonian MacBrayne ferry services in the Clyde and Western Isles.
